The overall College policy is not to overate one generic solution for every eligible student but instead to look at bespoke solutions for academic and vocational areas that had particular problems with incoming literacy or numeracy gaps. We feel that this targeted approach will bring the best value to our students

Difiguidance sets out that funding provided to Hacford Sixth Form College via the Education and Skills Funding Agency 16 19 Tuition Fund to support catch up resulting from lock down, should be used to support students who

- have not achieved a grade 5 or above in either GCSE Finglish or Maths. The funding is to provide assistance for targeted students to complete their overall programmes successfully.
- have agade 5 or above in Figishant/or maths, are from an economically disadvantaged badgound and would need catch up support. Students economically disadvantaged are defined as students from the 27% most economically deprived areas of the country based on the lines of Multiple Deprivation.

All supported students must be on a 16 to 19 study programme and have hed their learning disrupted by the Gronewinus (COVID 19) pandenic. Approximately 20% of curstudents correspond Welsh feeders drocks, to ensure a fair distribution of the funding we will apply equivalent criteria to students with qualifications obtained in Weles
